Mechanical splicing mechanism: Usually a V-shaped groove with a clamping element that secures the fiber in place. Factory-installed fiber stub: Aligns with the incoming fiber for optical signal transmission. The fiber is inserted into the connector, clamped in the V-groove, and the wedge clip is removed to secure the connection. This process typically takes about 2 minutes, significantly reducing installation time compared to fusion splicing.
