OSHA 1910.399 and NEMA standards recommend that trays exposed to physical damage be installed at a minimum height of 2.5 meters (8 feet) above grade. Additional Considerations In hazardous or high-safety areas, the installation height may need adjustment to comply with fireproofing, explosion-proof, or other environmental requirements. Proper height also ensures adequate airflow and prevents overheating, especially when trays are filled up to their recommended cross-sectional limits (40–50% fill rate depending on cable type).
