

What wiring is needed for grounding a distribution box

5. **Verify Ground Resistance:** Use a voltmeter or ground resistance tester to measure the resistance between the distribution box and the earth. The resistance should meet safety standards, typically less than 25 ohms for general installations, and lower for sensitive equipment (e.g.,
