Arcing and Insulator Effects: Small arcs or micro-discharges can occur at sharp points, nicks, or weathered surfaces on conductors and insulators. These arcs generate a raspy buzz, typically modulated at twice the AC frequency (e.g., 120 Hz in a 60 Hz system), and are more noticeable on older or poorly maintained equipment .

Environmental and Operational Factors

Humidity and Rain: Increase the likelihood and intensity of corona discharge, making the buzzing louder .

Wind: Can cause physical movement of wires or components, adding to audible noise .

Load Conditions: Higher electrical loads can slightly increase operational hum due to stronger magnetic fields inside transformers or breakers .

While the buzzing or humming can be noticeable, it is usually not harmful and does not indicate imminent failure. Regular maintenance and inspection help ensure that noise levels remain within normal ranges and that any unusual sou...
