- Router Setup:** Power on the router after the ONT is active. Verify connectivity using the router's status lights and network testing tools.

Best Practices

- Cable Management:** Avoid sharp bends and maintain the minimum bend radius to prevent signal degradation.
- Connector Handling:** Always handle fiber connectors by the plastic housing and keep dust caps on until ready to connect.
- Testing:** Use tools like Optical Time Domain Reflectometers (OTDRs) or visual fault locators to check signal integrity.
- Indoor vs. Outdoor Cables:** Use appropriate jackets for environmental protection; avoid metal-sheathed fiber outdoors to maintain electrical isolation.
