

Wiring of the residual current device RCD socket in the distribution box

In a distribution box, the wiring is connected to the RCD to protect circuits and users from electric shock by monitoring current imbalance between live and neutral conductors. Role of the RCD A residual current device (RCD) is a safety device that detects leakage currents—when the current flowing through the live and neutral conductors is not equal, indicating a possible fault or current passing through a person—and trips the circuit to prevent electric shock . It does not protect against overcurrent or short circuits, so it is usually combined with a circuit breaker for full protection . Wiring Connections Single-phase connection: The incoming live (phase) and neutral wires from the main supply are connected to the input terminals of the RCD . The protective earth conductor is connected to the earth busbar in the distribution box. The output live wire from the RCD is connected to the overcurrent circuit breaker or directly to the sub-circuits. The neutral output can be connected to the neutral busbar . Three-phase connection: All three phase wires and the neutral are connected to the RCD input. Each phase output is connected to its respective overcurrent breaker, while the neutral output is connected to the neutral busbar . Distribution Board Integration The distribution board, also called a consumer unit, organizes the electrical supply safely. It typically contains: Double-pole MCBs (main isolator or main switch) RCDs for residual current protection Single-pole MCBs or fuses for individual circuits The RCD is wired in-line with the circuits it protects, ensuring that any leakage current triggers the device to cut off power immediately, enhancing safety for users and appliances . Safety Considerations Always ensure the RCD is rated for the maximum current of the circuits it protects. Regularly test the RCD using its test button to confirm functionality . If the RCD trips, identify and fix the fault before rese...
